FLASHBACK TO SPRING 2021

Participating institutions in CT and MA started accepting students through the Guarantee:

- Students needed a completed associate degree from a public community college in the same state.
- They needed to meet the minimum cumulative GPA (2.0, 2.5, or 3.0) set by their intended transfer destination.
- Students were guaranteed that **all credits** would count towards their bachelor's.
- They were guaranteed consideration for institutional aid (scholarships & grants)



















KEY FINDINGS FROM THE 2022 GUARANTEE REPORT



Transfer students showed strong track record of academic achievement

The average cumulative community college GPA for Guarantee students between Spring 2021 and Spring 2022 was a 3.33, which is well above the highest GPA threshold that participating institutions can select as Guarantee admissions criteria.



Guarantee students tend to enroll full-time upon transfer to participating institutions

Because of the strong association between full-time enrollment and desirable vertical transfer outcomes, it was reassuring to see that over three-fourths (77%) of Guarantee students in the inaugural reporting period are enrolling full-time.



Guarantee students are consistently being awarded significant institutional scholarships

Guarantee students who enrolled between Spring 2021 and Spring 2022 were **awarded**, in sum, well over \$4.5 million dollars in institutional scholarships and grants.



Guarantee students are, in various ways, diverse

Community college students trend on the older side, and the Guarantee students analyzed trended similarly-with a median age of 26. Perhaps more interesting given the image of especially independent institutions of New England as very white, 44% of this group of Guarantee students were identified as BIPOC in the data participating institutions submitted to NEBHE for the Spring 2021 to Spring 2022 terms.








ENROLLMENT TOTALS, SINCE PROGRAM INCEPTION

Reflecting a 56% increase in unique students from 2022 data collection
















2023 DATA COLLECTION











IS THIS JUST FOR LIBERAL ARTS MAJORS?



Since Fall 2022, NEBHE team worked with IR reps to improve **certain data elements**; **new & improved data collection template was released** for use in the Spring 2023 collection cycle.



NEBHE is preparing to release the second annual Guarantee Enrollment Report, ft. new data from AY 2022-2023.





NEBHE is working with design partners to craft **new, additional Guarantee marketing tools** based on input gathered from Guarantee Coordinators in the context of Q1 meetings--building on Summer 2023 Aspen Institute-facilitated sessions on marketing to Transfer Students.
